4. ICS 200 is required for type II and team leads searchers

After you receive your SAR Volunteer approval letter or email:

State SAR Certification:

1. Step 1- Complete all of the class and field trainings
2. Step 2- Complete the OSSA Basic SAR written test with a score of 80% or better.

State certified volunteers are expected to attend a minimum of 40 hours of continuing education/training per calendar year in order to retain certified and active status with DCSAR. The 40 hours of continuing education/training can be obtained by (1) mission hours, (2) trainings from this schedule or (3) up to 10 hours credit from volunteer's unit training. For members who are working on their "State Basic SAR Certification" you will use this schedule to complete your "DC SAR Performance and Objective Work Book."

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
