**DOUGLAS COUNTY DOG CONTROL ADVISORY BOARD
DOG CONTROL BOARD MEETING
JULY 21ST, 2022**

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Chairman Martin Burnett, John Fine, and Terry Westfall

PRESENT: Deputy Lee Bartholomew-Sheriff's Office, Kathy Cross-Sheriff's Office

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Martin Burnett at 6:01 p.m.

BOARD APPOINTMENTS: Martin Burnett made the announcement of John Fine's appointment to the board by the Douglas County Board of Commissioner's.

BOARD CHAIR ELECTION: Terry Westfall made the motion to elect John Fine as Chairman. Martin Burnett seconded the motion. A vote was held, and all were in favor. John Fine was appointed as Chairman.

LIVESTOCK CLAIM: A livestock claim was filed in January for 3 ewes and 4 lambs were killed. The request was made for \$200 apiece for a total of \$1,400. Kathy Cross announced that this claim will be for the 2021-2022 budget year with a limit of \$1,000. There have been no other claims. Martin Burnett asked if there was any information on the dog who did the killings. Deputy Bartholomew reported that this particular dog had been running loose in the Galesville dam area for six months. He captured him in October, and he was taken to Saving Grace. He escaped from Saving Grace and continued to run around that area for three months. The first time this dog got into these particular sheep the dog didn't do any damage other than chasing. Deputy Bartholomew recognized the dog but couldn't catch it. The second time the dog got into these sheep and killed them, the sheep owner dispatched the dog. It's unknown who the original owner was.

Terry Westfall made a motion to pay \$1,000 to the claimant. John Fine seconded the motion. A vote was conducted, and the motion passed. \$1,000 will be paid to the claimant. Board members signed the claim and Kathy Cross notarized the document.

SET NEXT MEETING DATE AND ADJOURNMENT: Next meeting was set for October 26, 2022, at 6 p.m. Terry Westfall made a motion to adjourn. Terry Westfall seconded the motion. A vote was conducted and the motion to adjourn carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:11 p.m.
